
Talent on show at EMPAC




Working Bee

News from 1M

Term 3 has been very busy in 1M. We have been working very hard in our Writing and Maths. In particular, we have been super busy in our Integrated Curriculum lessons. Our topic for this term has been 'Living Things'. We have looked at how the features on our face differ from person to person – some students in our class have blue eyes, some have brown eyes and some have hazel eyes. We also noticed that we have three main hair colours in our class – brown, blonde and black. As well as looking at our facial features, we also took a walk around our school and looked at all the living things we have at school.



We saw flowers, trees and weeds and of course, the chickens. We looked at how flowers have seeds inside, and that they need water and sun in order to grow. We also did the 'Celery' experiment where we put two stalks of celery into jars and coloured the water of one jar with purple food dye. Over the next week, we watched as the celery with the coloured water also turned purple!

As well as all our wonderful lessons, we have also been working hard on our 'Celebration Night' item. It has been wonderful to see the students enthusiastic and keen to rehearse our item. We can't wait to share it with everyone on 'Celebration Night'.

VCE LEGAL STUDIES EXCURSION

As part of the Unit 1 & 2 VCE Legal Studies Course, students are required to study court room procedure. During Unit 1, students staged their own mock court trial in the classroom, arguing and defending a criminal case involving murder. For Unit 2, we had the opportunity to view the inside of the Myrtleford Magistrate’s Court and stage our mock court trial in the actual courtroom.

The mock court civil case involved a claim of negligence with respect to a food poisoning incident. Students undertook the roles of the courtroom personnel, plaintiff and defendant. All students participated and did a wonderful job of portraying their role in the court case. This opportunity has given the students a better understanding of the roles of the court room personnel and courtroom procedure.

During Term Four we are hoping to return to the courtroom and observe actual legal professionals carrying out their duties.


