

Years 7-12 Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Computer Program

Minimum Standards

Most of our computers are windows machines. However, computers that run the Apple OSX operating system can be catered for. **Other devices such as Ipads, Tablets, chromebooks, mobile phones do not suit our environment.**

As a minimum, both Window and OSX devices must have:

- Windows 10 Pro/enterprise/education or OSX 10.8 or greater (Windows 11 is OK)
- a Physical Keyboard
- Celeron Processor or greater
- 4GB Ram or greater
- 128 GB hard drive or greater
- 11.6" screen
- 6 hour battery life
- Wireless card (ac or gn)

A carry bag is highly recommended

Our Suppliers:

Two suppliers have established websites to assist in the purchase process:

These Sites will give purchasers more flexibility in repayment, warranty, and insurance options.

You are encouraged to use these sites / suppliers as the companies are used to supply education institutions and they know our minimum standards. You are not however compelled to use them as long as you have a device that meets the minimum standards.

As always please contact the College if you have any questions or are having difficulties with the supply of a BYOD device, there are a number of programs that may be of assistance.




We are very excited to offer a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) elective for students in Years 9 and 10 in 2022. To give students a little taster, we have been using Sphero robots to learn how to code and begin our study of the engineering design process.

Students have spent time getting familiar with the Sphero and its coding platform by learning how to navigate simple mazes. They were then tasked with building an obstacle course for the Sphero. Students constructed obstacles for their course, aiming to accrue as many points as possible for the different components they add to their course. Finally, students set out their obstacle course in the Multi Purpose Room and coded their Sphero to make their way through the course, autonomously.

Volcanoes erupting from our paper mâché is a cool experiment, you need to use baking soda and vinegar mixed together and it makes a huge fake eruption! By Aliza


