# LIBRARY NEWS *....Mrs Morgan*




Last week in the library we helped to celebrate Harmony Week, with displays and book collections celebrating the variety of cultures and diversity in our world today.



## NEW BOOK focus





A new Liz Pichon book (creator of the Tom Gates Series), "Shoe Wars" is in, so check that out if you love Tom Gates.






### Missing Mona Lisa M.I.A French people outraged

Latest news:

The Mona Lisa is missing from the Louvre Museum, Paris. It is one of the most famous Italian art pieces in the world. It was painted by Leonardo Da Vinci.

Director Enzo Dumont discovered that the painting was gone when he arrived at the Louvre at 8am on the 7<sup>th</sup> of April 2021. He ensured that the door was locked behind him. Then he called the local French police to inform them that the Mona Lisa was missing from the Louvre. When the French police arrived, they cordoned off the area. Evan admitted that he left work at about an hour early on Tuesday morning to at some "personal business". The detectives think when he said he had some "personal business" they thought it was really suspicious.

Suspect No.3 Sabine Marchal (Assistant Director of the Louvre, Paris): Sabine arrived at the Louvre promptly at 7am on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> April and unlocked the office entrance door. Sabine had a set of keys. Sabine then locked the door behind her. Margeaux Bouchet, Personal Assistant of Director Dumont, arrived at 7:40am. She rang the bell, so Sabine went and opened the office entrance door for Margeaux Bouchet. Director Dumont arrived at 9am. He left to go for his morning inspection at 9:15am. Director Dumont informed Margeaux via telephone that there was a problem in the Museum, so Sabine went to investigate. A security guard told Sabine that the Mona Lisa was missing and that the French police had been informed and were on their way. Suspect.

No.4 Margeaux Bouchet said that she saw the night janitor carrying a large parcel. The detectives thought that was pretty suspicious too.

Suspect No.5 Elise Oliver (the arts manager) was pretty suspicious, but she could not tell anymore because she hasn't been there for five years.
